Attendance procedures and letters sent home

What parents need to know

If a child reaches under 96% for their attendance a letter will be issued to let you know that your child is now on monitoring watch.

If your child shows no improvement and there are further absences you will receive a second letter inviting you to attend attendance meeting with Astrea Education Welfare Officer who will offer support.

If there is still no improvement a referral will be made for a fixed penalty notice.
